JESSICA'S JOURNEY



At 21 with a 2-year-old in tow, "Jessica" left her abuser at 3 a.m. while he was out of town for the weekend. She fled with money from her last paycheck – one he hadn't had a chance to take – and barely anything else.

After living for some time with a friend, abusive family members and then at The Julian Center, Jessica and her two sons came to Coburn Place after 14 months on the waitlist.

"Knowing that I'm safe inside the building helps me," she says. "And my kids being comfortable here has taken off a lot of stress because they're much happier."

Jessica has been working full-time and going to school while getting therapy for her son. She has worked hard on maintaining her mental health through her own therapy and is now in a healthy relationship.

Set to move out in July, Jessica has a 3.3 GPA and has improved her credit score significantly. She's looking into buying a home.

Her advocate, Sam, calls her a rock star. "She has come such a long way as an individual and a parent," she says. About 2020, Jessica says, "It's a bad year for sure, but given everything, I'm alright. This is probably the best I've ever been."

"If I could rate Coburn Place, I would give it 100%."






Life and Hope on the Waitlist

355 families on the waitlist in 2020


